Ancestry.com are running a free 1 month trial of Pro-Tools. The code is valid till the 22^{nd} of March. You will need to enter the code at the purchase page. This will give you an automated renewal every month so remember to cancel just prior to the rollover date. I have been curious about whether it would be useful and am happy to say that it has been – even just for tidying up my tree!
